From the Principal's Desk

March, 2012

Dear Parents,

Where has the year gone? We are already nearing Spring Break. It has been very busy at the school lately. By this time, I am sure most of you have seen the letter that was sent home regarding cellular devices. I recognize that we have taken a strong stand, but we are very cognizant of the need to protect our students. As you may be aware, we had a student video several other students on the playground and then post this on Facebook. This is a direct violation of the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act. It is an illegal action. The student in question was appropriately dealt with, but the situation highlighted a serious issue we have been trying to deal with for some time. More and more students are freely using their cell phones, etc throughout the day; texting, phoning, and videoing or snapping pictures. We have stated frequently that we had no issue with students using their devices off the school grounds, but that in school these had to be placed in their lockers and turned off. If that was followed by all, we would have no issue. Unfortunately, too many insist on pocketing their phones and doing their utmost to use them throughout the day. At some point these actions will place one of our students in a bad position. Pictures might be placed on a social interaction site, used to cyberbully, or some student who is supposed to be secure, perhaps hiding from an absent parent for example, has a picture posted, which blows his/her cover.

I have therefore told students not to bring these devices to school or they will be confiscated until a parent comes to retrieve it. I do recognize that some parents legitimately have a need to be in contact with their children as they reach school and after the day. Otherwise, parents can always call the school (519-752-7486) and in an emergency they can speak with their children. While I do have the right to search lockers, my desire to do so matches your desire to root through your child's bedroom. It is an unpleasant task. Therefore, if students do have their cell phones in their lockers, turned off, there should be no issue. The text home could happen before they enter the school grounds and everyone is satisfied. Otherwise, these items will be confiscated as mentioned before. Parents will be contacted to arrange pick up.

Remember that our primary concern here is your child's safety. This is your wish as well, so we are hoping this arrangement will work for all.

Notes From Your School Health Nurse...

Making Lunches Nutritious and Delicious

Lunches are an important part of your child's growth and development. The foods that you pack in your child's lunch bag should be ones that will help them stay energized throughout the school day and will give them the nutrients that they need to grow healthy and strong.

Making lunches that suit not only picky eaters but also meet the balanced school day criteria can sometimes be tricky. Keep these helpful tips in mind to make packing lunches a breeze:

Head out the door with the mighty 4: A healthy lunch includes foods from at least 3 of the 4 food groups. If your child is on a balanced school day, the only thing that changes is the timing of when their food is eaten; so pack foods from 3 of the 4 food groups for each break and include 2 drinks as well – one for each break

Include everyone: Include your kids in planning/packing their food for the school day. They may be more willing to eat their lunch if they helped to make it

Pack lunches safely: Teach children to wash their hands before eating. Use an insulated lunch bag to keep cold foods cold and a thermos to keep hot foods hot. Wash all fruits and veggies before packing them

Feedback Feedback:

We have been noticing fewer returns from our Feedback forms lately. This could be due to very busy lives or maybe even be a result of a general satisfaction about the goings on at King George School. One parent has brought to light a real issue around the playground. King George School, like all elementary schools in the Grand Eire District School Board, is a non-smoking area. It has been pointed out that at the beginning and end of the school day a number of older siblings and parents are smoking in this area. Even teachers and school staff who smoke are required to leave the school grounds to smoke. We ask that all parents, etc who do smoke, please do so no closer than across the street from the school grounds. We recognize that this may be an imposition, but we all are aware that young children often try to emulate the actions of their parents and older siblings. We ask that you respect this request for the benefit of all our students.

Do take the time to respond to the issues you see at the school or the great things you see happening by filling out and returning the Feedback forms. Your opinions will be read and considered. Also, we do draw from the returned forms each month and the winner gets a free milk.
